DECORATIVE SECTION

Flowers and materials used in this section need not be grown by the Exhibitor.

No arrangement to exceed 45cm in width.

Only natural (not artificial) plant material to be used – this includes fresh, dried, garden, wild, foliage, fruit, fungi, vegetables and seaweed.

Accessories allowed in all Classes.

Formal flower arranging skills are not needed and all entries are very welcome.

- **20.** Outdoor Display of Mixed Annuals seen on public view (including hanging baskets, window boxes, etc.) to be judged on Show day

Class 50 – Recipe

Ukrainian Apple Cake (Yabluchnyk)

Ingredients

Cake:

250g plain flour

60g caster sugar

2 teaspoons baking powder

¼ teaspoon salt

115g butter, cut into pieces

80ml double cream

1 large egg, beaten

3 large apples - peeled, cored, and thinly sliced

Streusel topping:

120g brown sugar

2 tablespoons plain flour

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

30g cold butter, cut into small pieces

Method

Pre-heat the oven to 190°C (170 °C Fan, Gas Mark 5). Lightly grease an 8-inch cake tin.

Sift flour, sugar, baking powder, and salt into a mixing bowl. Rub in butter until mixture is crumbly.

Whisk cream and egg together in a small bowl; add to flour mixture and gently mix until a soft dough forms.

Press into the prepared baking dish. Layer apples over top in neat rows, overlapping slightly.

Make the streusel topping: mix brown sugar, flour, and cinnamon together in a small bowl. Rub in butter until mixture is crumbly. Sprinkle topping over apples.

Bake in the preheated oven until apples have softened and topping is golden brown, about 25 minutes.
