Advent: The art of waiting well

There's something in the air at this time of year — a kind of charged stillness, like the pause before the first note of a symphony. Advent is the season of waiting, but not the sort of waiting we do in a queue at the Post Office, shifting from foot to foot and checking the clock. Advent waiting is different. It's active, alert, expectant — the sort of waiting that leans forward rather than slumps back.

We know what we're waiting for, of course: Christmas. But the Church has always taught that Advent isn't just about looking back to Bethlehem, but also looking ahead – to Christ's coming again, and to his quiet coming among us in the everyday moments of now. It's a season that stretches our sense of time, reminding us that God's promises are not bound by our calendars, and that sometimes what we need most is to be still and make room.

That's not easy in December. The shops have been in full festive throttle since October, and our diaries fill faster than our stockings. The temptation is to rush through Advent so that we can 'get to' Christmas. Yet if we skip the waiting, we miss the wonder. The early Christians called this time *Adventus*, a word meaning both *arrival* and *presence*. The two belong together: if we never learn to wait, we never truly recognise the presence when it comes.

Perhaps the waiting itself is a gift. Like a seed beneath the soil, there's a quiet work going on in us while we wait – a deepening of hope, a strengthening of trust. The prophet Isaiah wrote, 'Those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength.' Waiting is not wasted time; it's soul-building time.

So this Advent, perhaps we might practise waiting well. Light a candle in the window, take a few quiet moments each day, resist the rush to finish everything, and simply notice. Notice where hope is stirring. Notice where love is already at work. Notice how Christ is nearer than we thought.

When the angels sing 'Glory to God in the highest', they will not be breaking the silence so much as completing it – the long, beautiful silence of a people who have learned how to wait. And that, perhaps, is the real miracle of Christmas.

There's lots happening at The Bungalow in the run-up to Christmas. The lights on the Christmas tree are being switched on at Millennium Green at 4.45 pm on **Saturday 6 December**. Thorner School choir are singing carols and there is a blessing and a speech and even an appearance by Father Christmas. So it should be a great event to start off the Christmas season. Following this, The Bungalow will be providing refreshments again. We are serving mulled wine and mince pies in the Bungalow, and hot chocolate and biscuits from the boule shelter next door. It's cash only, so please remember to bring some money.

We've had some really good news about our heating bills. A few years ago the Over 60s was one of the early organisations to join a national network offering welcoming and warm places in the winter months, through a scheme called Welcome Spaces. This year they've very kindly awarded us a grant of £725 towards our heating costs, which will be a huge help. We now control the heating system remotely, which should also reduce our energy consumption.

Please make a note of 12 noon on **Friday 23 January 2026**. That's when we are booked into the Wetherby Whaler for a three-course lunch, which includes tea or coffee. It is £18 per person.

A few years ago Arthritis Care and Arthritis Research UK came together to form one organisation, Versus Arthritis, which has a box of greetings cards on sale at The Bungalow. The charity recently collected £45.25 and thanks everyone for their support.

New footpath map shows the way!

Thorner is blessed with a network of attractive rural public rights of way – almost 24 miles of pleasant footpaths and bridleways within the parish boundary. They give access to a wider network across neighbouring parishes – Scholes, Barwick, Scarcroft, Bardsey and Bramham, offering a wonderful free resource for keeping fit, relaxing and viewing wildlife.

A updated map of the parish rights of way has been installed in a display frame on the wall of the boule shelter on Thorner's Main Street, a reminder of what's available on the doorstep. It was designed by local artist Michael Brereton, helped by members of Thorner Art Group, whose illustrations give a hint of just a few of the features of our local heritage and countryside. Thorner Parish Council met the costs of printing.

A reminder to dog owners – there have been some unfortunate incidents this year of livestock being harassed by dogs, with lambs killed and horses injured. So if you're out walking, stay on the rights of way, and keep your dog on a lead when there is livestock about.

You can help:

- Do you have ideas for enhancing local knowledge of the heritage around us?
- What local features are in need of improvement? How can we draw more attention to what's there and at risk of being lost?
- Would you be willing to help in maintaining stretches of footpath cutting back growth obstructing paths or improving stiles and waymarking?

Thorner Parish Centre renovation

The Parish Centre is being rejuvenated! All the external stonework is being repointed and sealed, which will improve its cosmetic appearance and eliminate damp penetration into the interior. Grants for this work have been received from Leeds City Council (Emmerdale Fund) and nPower Business Solutions.

In addition, all 24 old fluorescent tubes have been replaced with modern soft LED lighting. We have been awarded a grant from Thorner Community Fund to carry out this work. This will save the Parish Centre money on energy costs and will help us with our journey towards being carbon-neutral.

A message from the Bodenhams

After 33 years in Thorner, we are relocating to south-west Scotland in early December. We send our best wishes to all our friends and neighbours.

Thorner Net Zero Partnership



The Thorner Net Zero Partnership is continuing its mission to make our community buildings more energy efficient, more comfortable and more sustainable for the future. The partnership brings together four village venues – The Bungalow (Thorner Over 60s Association), Thorner Parish Centre, St Peter's Church, and Thorner

Victory Hall – working jointly to reduce energy use, lower carbon emissions, and cut running costs. Over the past year, each of the buildings has been acting on recommendations from the Energy Audit and Recommendations Report produced by D3 Associates (D3A) and funded by Thorner Community Fund. The report has given all four groups a clear roadmap towards improved efficiency, and we're already seeing positive results. Some of the key actions taken so far include:

- Improved insulation and draught-proofing, helping retain warmth and reduce heating demand.
- LED lighting upgrades, cutting energy use significantly.
- Heating system reviews and smart controls, ensuring warmth when and where it's needed, and reducing wasted energy.
- Solar PV installations at the Victory Hall and The Bungalow, for renewable energy generation onsite.

These efforts are not only helping to reduce carbon emissions but also making our community spaces more comfortable and financially resilient as energy costs continue to rise. We've also been joined recently by Thorner Bowling Club and Thorner Mexborough Cricket Club, who are hoping to improve their buildings in a similar way.

In 2026, the four original TNZP organisations will be sharing their learning and experiences, demonstrating what's possible for any home or building in the village. By working together, we aim to show practical examples of carbon reduction in action right here in Thorner.

Regular updates on the project's progress can be found on the 'Thorner Net Zero Partnership' Facebook page, the village website and in future editions of the parish magazine.

Together, we're proving that small changes and strong community collaboration can make a big difference.
